Summer Art Classes

The Art Gallery of Algoma is excited to offer a series of Summer Art Classes for Children!

Classes will run weekly beginning July 8th through August 23rd 2024. Morning and afternoon classes differ primarily in skill level, and age divisions are somewhat flexible based on the skill level of participants. One week of classes is \$150 for AGA Members and \$200 for the general public. Please note that classes during the week of August 6-9 will be a shortened week, priced at \$120 for AGA Members and \$160 for the general public.

MORNING CLASSES: Ages 5-9, 9:30am-12:00pm

WEEK 1: July 8-12, 2024

Exploring Algoma

Be inspired by the famous Group of Seven artists who explored the Algoma region. Students will use graphite, watercolours, and acrylics, and learn the art of plein air painting to depict beautiful Algoma landscapes. Indoor and outdoor art fun!

WEEK 2: July 15-19, 2024

Blast Off to Outer Space

Get inspired by planets, galaxies, aliens, and rocket ships this week. Students will use watercolour and acrylic paints, as well as pastels and mixed media to create their own space-themed artworks.

WEEK 3: July 22-26, 2024

Let's Set Sail

Oceans, lakes, fish, boats, and pirates – it's all here! Students will work with graphite, paint, collage, and recycled objects to create colourful artworks that explore water.

WEEK 4: July 29 - August 2, 2024

Bon Appetit

Transform your favourite foods into art! Students will be inspired to create painted rocks, sculptures, drawings, and paintings as they create projects that focus on food for breakfast, lunch, dinner, and snacks, as well as special dishes from around the world.

WEEK 5: August 6-9, 2024

Paper Creations

Students will have fun using paper in a variety of ways such as cutting, tearing, folding, and gluing. They will create realistic and abstract artwork exploring the basic elements of design.

WEEK 6: August 12-16, 2024

Cartoons and Animation

In this very popular class, students will use simple elements of animation and create storyboards to tell a story of their own. Drawing, painting, and sketching will be learned.

WEEK 7: August 19-23, 2024

Wizards, Unicorns, and Spells - Oh My!

Dive into magical worlds where adventure stories and fantastical creatures abound. Magical beings, animals, and plants will inspire students to create their own imaginative artworks.

Summer Art Classes

AFTERNOON CLASSES: Ages 10-14, 1:30pm-4:00pm

WEEK 1: July 8-12, 2024

Inspired by the Group of Seven

Students will paint in the style of the Group of Seven outside as the Group did. They will explore perspective and document the scenery around them. The travelling exhibition, Cobalt: A Mining Town and the Canadian Imagination, originally from the McMichael Canadian Art Collection in Kleinburg, Ontario will be displayed at the Art Gallery of Algoma during the summer months. This exhibition includes several artworks by Group of Seven members. Students will learn about this exhibition and be inspired to create their own artworks!

WEEK 2: July 15-19, 2024

Eco Explorers

Explore the natural world and be inspired by flowers, pollinators, and the environment around you. Students will create artwork using recycled materials, painting, collage, and sculpting.

WEEK 3: July 22-26, 2024

Wearable Art and Jewelry-making

Students will use a variety of artistic media to create their own beautiful wearable art and jewelry. They will explore textiles, paper, and beads to make colourful art they can wear for every occasion.

WEEK 4: July 29 - August 2, 2024

Flora and Fauna

Nature is a constant inspiration for artists. Students will use many different types of artistic media to create art about animals and plants.

WEEK 5: August 6-9, 2024

Paper Designs

Students will explore various paper crafts including collage, to create realistic and abstract artwork exploring basic elements of design, including colour, line, and shape.

WEEK 6: August 12-16, 2024

It's Storytime

Students will paint and draw their own comics, cartoons, and zines. They will learn about drawing and painting techniques, as well as typography and storyboarding, to tell different stories through art.

WEEK 7: August 19-23, 2024

Abstract Art

Explore the work of several of the twentieth century's most famous abstract artists, including Helen Frankenthaler (1928-2011), Wassily Kandinsky (1866-1944), Lee Krasner (1908-84), Piet Mondrian (1872-1944), Jackson Pollock (1912-56), and Mark Rothko (1903-70). Each of these artists boldly experimented with colour, line, and space in innovative ways that continue to shape contemporary art today. Students will create unique pieces in a variety of mediums inspired by these abstract artists.
